## It Just Keeps Getting Better

T'S HARD TO SUMMARIZE 25 years of addiction and hopelessness," John says. "But the most important element to my story is that when no one else wanted anything to do with me, the Santa Barbara Rescue Mission welcomed me with open arms."

> It's a far cry from the life he was born into – the life he thought he was destined to stay trapped in just like his father, his aunt, and his uncle always were.

#### **Born into Chaos and Addiction**

"One of my first childhood memories, around 6 years old, was seeing my father in a drunken rage holding my mom up in the air by her throat as he punched her in the stomach," he says.

A few years later, John started drinking. When he was 16, his father gave him crack for the first time.

His addiction continued for decades — through John getting married and having kids. When he and his wife divorced and he lost custody of his boys, John's despair grew so deep he didn't think he'd ever get out of it.

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# **It Just Keeps Getting Better**

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John ended up in jail, where the judge released him on the condition that he come to the Mission and go through our 12-month Residential Recovery Program.

"I thought at first this would be just another institution," he says. "But it was not. It rekindled my relationship with God. And I didn't realize all the changes, re-growth, and the spiritual connection that would be instilled in me here."

John graduated from the program in 2013, and in the last 10 years, his life has taken turns he never could have dreamed of.

#### **Being the Father He Never Had**


John was awarded sole custody of his boys in 2015 and has done everything he can to show them what a healthy family looks like. He also earned a degree in engineering and has gone on to work with some of the most impressive companies in Santa Barbara there are! He worked with NASA on a solar array that attached to the satellite Lucy and attended the launch in 2021. He recently accepted a new job working on high-end specialty computers.

"I am blown away," he says.

John's boys are both grown, and both have good jobs that they enjoy. John is in close contact with them and says their relationships are strong and healthy something that he never dreamed was possible from his own upbringing.

"Because of the program and the staff, I have a foundation of faith and recovery that has given me a life filled with hope, ambitions, and love," John says.

## Have you ever wondered? Rolf Answers Your Most Frequently Asked Questions

**Question:** What can be done about some of the people that are clearly dealing with mental illness and living on the street?

**Answer:** It's heartbreaking to see the escalation of mental illness on the streets. But the fact is there are limited resources focused on mental health, and for too long we've been relying on the wrong systems — like law enforcement

— to help get these people off the streets. But being incarcerated doesn't typically help anyone with their mental health!

That's why the Mission is investing in new ways to address mental health so we can help struggling people with compassion and grace to find healing and transformation. It will look different than recovering from addiction, but it's a piece of the puzzle we're working hard to address.

# Long-Term Recovery is a **Family Affair**

While our residents in the 12-month Residential Treatment Program have been digging into the causes of their addiction, often their families haven't started doing their own work yet. Family Day happens every other month for residents in the program and their families.

#### **Family Day Participants:**

- Learn how to identify and avoid co-dependency.
- Learn how addiction impacts the family system.
- Receive helpful information and community resources.
- Process their experiences in a supportive environment.
- And learn to set healthy boundaries.

A family approach to recovery is essential to rebuilding relationships and reestablishing healthy habits.

After battling addiction for 25 years, John came to the Mission and learned he did have a choice. And John chose transformation.


It wasn't quick. Transformation never is. But the work that John was able to do at the Mission has lasted for more than a decade, and it's impacted the lives of millions of people. His work
