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An Unimaginable Miracle

There's no better way for you to understand the hope and miracles made possible by your support than to hear directly from someone whose life has been forever changed by your generosity. There's no better person to do that than J.P. I'll let him tell you all about it. – **Rolf**

Y STORY BEGINS right here in Santa Barbara in the small mountain community of Painted Cave.

I don't have any childhood memories of my father. From what I've been told, my dad left when I was around the age of 1 and my mother shortly after, leaving me, my older sister, and older brother with my grandparents.

Desperate for Escape

My grandfather was a heavy alcoholic and would go on the usual one-week vodka benders, often followed by the police taking him to jail. I was ashamed of my homelife, especially while going to school, seeing the perfect families with moms and dads.

When I was in sixth grade, my brother, who is 8 years older, introduced me to weed. I found my escape. By 7th grade, I was uninterested in school. At the end of 8th grade, my mother moved back to Santa Barbara, struggling with addiction to crystal meth and alcohol abuse. By this time, I was a full-blown pothead and enjoyed the occasional drink. The next few years were a blur.

My Dysfunctional Life

The summer before my senior year, after I had turned 18, I came home one night to find my mom spun out of her mind on meth. All my stuff was out in the driveway. Time for me to go.

I ended up renting a playhouse in my friend's backyard that was built for his little sister. This was my senior year. This was my dysfunctional life.

Three Years on the Streets

At 18, I found heroin. Every negative feeling, emotion, thought, and person was immediately drowned out.

Within three months, I was fully addicted. After having a daughter and her mom leaving me, and then meeting my son's mom and being in jail for his birth, I ended up homeless, couch surfing, sleeping in cars and garages, and wandering the streets for three years.

The days were dark.

I wanted everything to be over. I was empty. I was lost. I needed help.

God's House

Help came in the form of the Santa Barbara Rescue Mission. I still don't exactly know how I got there. My conclusion is, it's God's house and He drew me in.

Words can't describe what I accomplished inside myself with my year there. I was challenged and listened to by a staff that genuinely cares. The year I spent there was the best year of my life up until that point.

And those relationships don't end at graduation. J.P., like many of our other graduates, has stayed close to the men he went through the program with and has spent the last 12 years mentoring others, giving them a supportive community that they never had before.

"Today I give back to the community from which I took so much," J.P. says. "I have sponsored dozens of men in the program. I continue to stay involved in AA also, sponsoring as many people as I can."

Even if you don't have a background of addiction, you can be a great mentor! We're always looking for people to walk alongside our residents to serve as a Christian role model and encourage them through regular connection and ongoing relationships.
